These After School Conversation Starters might help:

Instead of 'Who did you sit with?' try 'Tell me the names of four people you worked with today'

Instead of 'Was everyone nice to you?' try 'Who did you most enjoy talking to? Did anyone have anything interesting to say?'

Instead of 'Was the work too hard or easy?' try 'What was the best thing you were asked to do today in maths?'

Instead of 'Who did you play with?' try "What was the best game you played at lunchtime? What did you chat about?'
