Home Learning

We are making some changes to home learning this year. For the first half term of the autumn term we would like all children in the Federation to spend some time at home practising skills that will help them succeed in every area of school life.

Depending upon the age of your child, we would like you to read to them frequently and for your child to read to you too - as often as possible. Junior School children should read their Accelerated Reader book.

We would like your child to practise their **number and arithmetic** skills. Infant children can do this practically or by logging on to 'Education City', Junior School children can do this by learning their tables, and using 'Mathletics' to use their knowledge in context.

Finally, we would like:

Infant and Nursery children to have access to plenty of pens, crayons and paper so that they can freely draw and to write.

Junior children to practise their spelling. Each week the children will bring home a list of words that they need to be able to spell, and it will really help them if you can go over these with them. Word lists will be given out on Thursdays, with a spelling test on Tuesdays.

So, across the Federation you don't need to write anything in a home learning book for now, but your child will do better at school if they spend time at home working on these basic skills.

Most of the Junior School children have now completed at least one STAR test, and have been allocated an Accelerated Reader book.

As always, the books that a few children have taken home are not quite right for them — we do our best to get it right, but no system is ever perfect. If your child doesn't have a book, or you think their book is too hard or easy, please have a work with their teacher and we can put things right.

The children can change their book as often as they like during the week, and the library is open after school (until 3.30pm) on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays if you would like to help them choose a new book, or want to have a look at the available selection.
