# DISCOVER the world of wonderful apples

Last week our Year 2 children set off to visit the Royal Horticultural Garden RHS Rosemoor near Torrington <u>www.rhs.org.uk/gardens/rosemoor</u>

They were on a mission to find out more about apples – our whole school project this half term. Children visited Devon's 'Mother Orchard' recently set up in the garden which will provide seed for 100s of heritage apples. As well as touring the wonderful gardens the children learnt many amazing facts about this abundant and healthy fruit. Elijah from 2E says 'did you know...

- There are more than 7,500 varieties of apples grown around the world. It would take you more than 20 years to try them all if you ate one a day!
- Apples can be as small as a cherry to as big as a grapefruit.
- Most apples have 10 seeds.

Just before half term we are looking forward to Theatre Alibi <u>www.theatrealibi.co.uk</u> bringing the children their current performance 'Apple John'.
