## **School Libraries**

We are really lucky to have two well stocked libraries. The children have opportunities during the school day to change their books and we try to make sure that they have all got an interesting book 'on the go'.

At the Junior School the children have an Accelerated Reader book that is linked to their 'Zone of Proximal Development'. They can choose any book from the free choice section of the library (open after school each day).

At the Infant School the children have a 'Guided Reading' book which they work on reading really fluently, plus they can choose a library book each week (open after school on Thursdays).

After school you are welcome to come in for browsing and renewing books or just to spend a bit of time together with your child, enjoying the relaxing library surroundings.


Two children have joined the

There was an abundance of problem solving with the children sharing ideas and negotiating. We were particularly pleased with their levels of persistence when things didn't work out as they planned. Many thanks to everyone who completed the Junior School Home Learning Survey last term. We had over 100 returns, and the key findings were:

**79%** of you think the amount of homework the children get is about right. There is an even split of you who would like more/less homework.

**86%** of you would prefer weekly maths and English tasks to long-term projects or 'making' activities.

91% of children make good use of online resources

86% of you feel you get good feedback about completed homework.

It is also clear that we need a more consistent approach across the school to the days homework is set and returned

We will be using this information to plan our approach to homework in the future so thank you. Remember, you can see you child's homework by going on to the school website, clicking 'curriculum' and then 'Show my Homework'.
