Thank you to everyone who completed the recent homework survey. We have been trialling a new system of homework menus at the Junior School this year, and we were keen to hear your view about how it has been working.

We will be analysing the results fully, but wanted to give you an idea of the main findings from the people who responded.

65% prefer the homework menus to set tasks 12% aren't sure

23% preferred the previous type of homework
