We are really pleased that every class in the school has made better than expected progress since we started using the system. Home Learning for Year 1 and Year 2 We have been reviewing the 'Home Learning' we set for children in Key Stage 1 this year and for the coming summer term you will notice some further small changes. In addition to the weekly reading that we expect every child to do at home and the practice e-tasks for maths using Education City, there are new half termly learning tasks children can work on at their own pace. Home Learning can be brought in to share and celebrate during a specific week set aside for this.

We have provided some time guidelines for children depending upon their age and hope this helps families to enjoy learning together at home for the appropriate amount of time. Too long spent on home learning makes it become a chore - a good tip is to stop whilst you are enjoying working together then your child will be keen to return to the task! Keep on going until you are both fed up will not help either of you feel enthusiastic about learning together. Why not set a timer to count the minutes? Above all, enjoy these early years when your child does want your help and attention.
