Assemblies

At the infant school the focus of our assemblies this half term is 'Making Choices'

We began thinking about easy choices such as 'shall I eat an apple or an orange?'. We thought about choosing or not choosing to recycle and choices on Kelso's Wheel. Last week we thought about making choices that are 'right' or 'wrong'. This coming week children will be thinking about how parents and families help them to learn about right and wrong choices. Maybe you could look out for times when you could talk about **choices** at home.

Your child's online safety education this term

This term all Junior School classes will be studying a unit of work based on using new online technology safely, developing skills in resilience, self-esteem and positive attention seeking behaviour. It has been produced by the National Crime Agency's child protection education programme <u>Thinkuknow</u>.

In particular the Thinkuknow educational activities introduce scenarios and reflection about **'Live Streaming'**. Live streaming is the broadcasting of real-time, live video to an audience over the internet. All you need to be able to live stream is an Internet enabled device, like a smart phone or tablet with a camera, and an app that has a 'Live' function, such as YouTube, Instagram Live or Musica.ly.

#Live Skills

To help support children to enjoy live streaming safely, if they are currently doing it, or for those that may be introduced to it when they start secondary school, these educational activities focus on building children's skills to know who to trust online and how to get affirmation in positive ways at home and school. These skills are important for navigating both the online and offline world.
