

## Chicken Update

Our chickens are classed as a 'Backyard Flock' and in response to the Guidance from DEFRA we will be minimising direct and indirect contact between poultry and wild birds by:

- making sure that feed and water can't be accessed by wild birds
- taking all reasonable precautions
- increased cleansing and disinfection of equipment and footwear
- fitting wildlife deterrents

Look out for this in your bookbags at the Infant and Nursery School.
