Chickens

The restrictions imposed by DEFRA to reduce the risk of avian flu spreading in the wild bird population are now over, and happily our Federation chickens can spread their wings again.

At the Infant and Nursery School Mrs Ford co-ordinates a great team of children and staff who care for the chickens and sell or use the eggs. Our main flock of 6 live behind Class 2HO but you may have noticed that two of our most adventurous chickens are starting to make regular visits to Class 1F's class garden.

At the Junior School, under the guidance of Mr Poustie, a dedicated group of children have learnt about taking responsibility for and caring for something that can't look after itself. They have to think about the chickens' welfare, including researching the best food and bedding. They also have to ensure the chickens are properly cared for in the school holidays.

The Federation chickens provide a valuable and lively learning resource for all of our children!
