With the newsletter, you will be receiving details of the final Federation 'Home Learning Task' of the school year.


One of our Early Help for Mental Health '10-a-Day' strategies is to 'do something that you are good at or enjoy'.


Linked to this, the home learning task will involve your child finding a way of sharing something that they like doing with the rest of their class.
