Dan made this to put on his window in the kitchen so everyone that passes by smiles. A lovely idea, and a great message to share.






Seonwoo has been busy creating beautiful pictures.

Zia and Jiho have been decorating eggs with a rainbow-themed Stoke Hill logo.


