Year 2 Learning Letter

This Term's Project

'Hot and Cold Down Under!'

An exciting Autumn term has begun with our project titled 'Hot and Cold Down Under!' In Year 2, we plan to be learning about the seven continents of the world – beginning with exploring the country Australia through art, dance, music, geography and design technology. Children will be finding out about Aboriginal art and making observational drawings of animals. They will explore colour combinations and create their own Aboriginal inspired paintings. In computing children will learn how to create basic code and will also be focusing on developing research and word processing skills, promoting the use of both hands for typing. Science will take us on a journey around the world where we will be learning about different habitats across the continents and sorting and classifying information that we discover.

Mathematics

This term we will be consolidating and extending the children's mathematical knowledge. start the year, we plan a large emphasis on place value and number facts. This knowledge is fundamental to the rest of our maths learning. Keep practising counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s wherever possible! The children will also be learning about measure (length, money, time) and the properties of 2D shapes. Problem solving will be integrated into our maths lessons so children can apply their skills. Sessions will always include a 'challenge' element to extend learning and for children to 'grow their brain'.

English

We have started the term with story writing, inspired by stories from other cultures. Listen out for us reciting (with actions) a range of Australian stories including 'Wombat goes Walkabout.'

Non-fiction writing and traditional tales will also be studied. As we progress through the term children will continue to develop their vocabulary and grammatical knowledge and show this in their writing.

As the children become more confident writers we will be really focusing on presentation and layout. All children need to be trying their best to join their handwriting now they are in Year 2.

ESSENTIAL each week:

Reading

Make a time to read regularly. Little and often is best but as the complexity and length of book increases more time might be needed. Priority should be given to the Guided Reading text. Always have a conversation about what your child has read and understood.

Maths

x3 sessions of up to 15 minutes practise of the current maths skills on Education City. New homelearning tasks will be updated fortnightly.

Lost your Education City log-in? Ask your class teacher to provide you with this again.

No internet? Drop into the ICT suite on a Monday after school with your child. someone will be there and will be happy to help.

OPTIONAL to enjoy over the

Autumn Term to further support your child's learning and skills. How much time to spend on each task will depend on the activity. A good rule to go by is... enough time to enjoy but not too much time to make learning a chore.

Draw: Try and draw/create some Australian animals using a variety of media. Maybe you could paint a picture or make a sculpture.

Research: Can you find out about the different species of animals that live in hot and cold climates?
