From next week all members of staff across both schools will be offered the chance to take self-administered twice weekly Covid tests. The idea is that this will allow us to pick up asymptomatic cases, and break the chains of transmission within the community.

This does mean, however, that there is more likelihood that we will find positive cases amongst our staff which could lead to more groups of children having to self-isolate for a time. We will continue to provide online learning if this is the case, although this may have to be in a different format if a teacher becomes unwell.

Full time attendance has dropped by 39% making school considerably safer for children and staff. We hope you have enjoyed a good week of Remote Learning and that the Learn and Explore or Project booklet came through the post to support you.
