

KS1 Stoke Hill Federation Religious Education Curriculum 2020

Intent: by the end of KS1 children will have acquired the knowledge and skills for this subject, as set out in the Devon and Torquay Agreed Syllabus for R.E. 2019 - 24

Implementation: we have allocated subject content to year groups. Curriculum delivery is typically planned weekly.. NOTE: for how learning in the Early Years prefaces learning in this subject see the EYFS curriculum documents.

Impact: we know that we will have delivered the curriculum successfully if children are able to 'make sense of religious and non-religious beliefs' *RE Today 2029*

Children are taught knowledge, skills and understanding though learning about Christians, Muslims and Jew. Children may also encounter other religious and worldviews where applicable.
