Spellings

Teachers teach a range of spelling strategies to the children during the term. They use the No Nonsense Spelling scheme to support their teaching. Children will be challenged by spellings at their level and the teachers teach the spelling and the meanings of the year 5 and 6 statutory word list. Teachers will use a range of methods to assess whether the words can be spelt, and they can be used in the correct context. Children will not have word lists sent home to be learnt for a test unless this is part of an individual plan linked to the needs of that child.

In maths the children will be expected to complete the online learning set by their teacher. For this half term this will be continuing with Mathletics, which the children have been using in class. Some children will also use TTRockstars. They should spend 20-30 minutes on this each week.
