
Professional Development

This week the Federation hosted a training session for all the teachers in the River Exe Learning Partnership www.riverexelearningpartnership.org

Altogether, over 50 teachers were involved. We all took part in a variety of workshops designed to help develop our art skills, which will in turn lead to a wider range of opportunities for the children as part of the Art curriculum.

The benefit of being part of the Partnership is that we were able to offer this opportunity to our teachers at virtually no cost, using the expertise already present within our schools. It was also great for teachers to talk to and learn from each other about the approaches they use when teaching Art.

What did we learn at Cricklepit Mill?

The children in the Foundation Stage have been learning the traditional tale of the 'Little Red Hen'

This week they set off to visit Cricklepit Mill near Exeter Quay to discover more about the ancient technology that has ground wheat into flour for hundreds of years. Four volunteer millers showed the children how this 'marvellous machine', powered by a water wheel, changed the tiny hard grains of wheat into silky soft flour for making bread. It was just like in the story! The mill building is now the head office of the Devon Wildlife Trust so we couldn't pass up the opportunity for a spot of bug hunting and drawing whilst we were there!

Amy Bickford, one of our school governors came along too. 'The children loved finding out how flour was made. They asked some brilliant questions. It was great to see learning in action.'
