A very warm welcome to our children and families, both old and new. Thank you for your support so far this term, we think the children have settled in brilliantly and are already learning the routines and making new friends.

Even though you are unable to come into the Nursery building at the moment, we hope that you know you can talk to any member of the Nursery team about your child.

Project

During this first half term we will be playing alongside the children and encouraging them to explore all the different resources that are available both inside and out.

Some clear interests and ideas have already emerged from the children including designing and creating sculptures from natural materials such as acorns and conkers. The children have also already started to use the real tools for their models.

Through stories children can express their own thoughts and emotions, learn new exciting words and build the foundations for language development.
