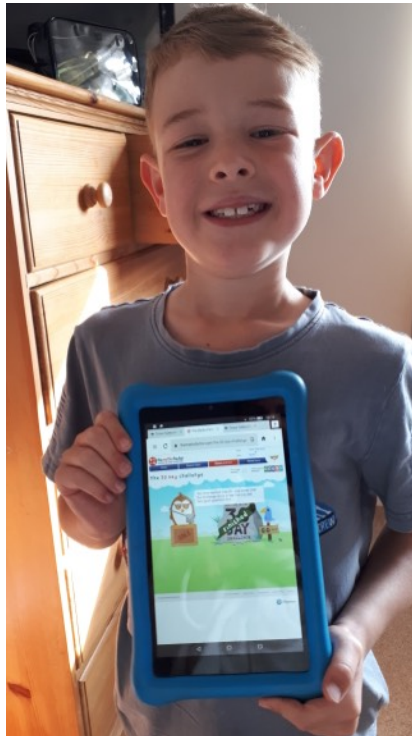

Conrad took this picture of the 'super moon' earlier this week. You could try and find out why the moon looked much bigger than usual - it hasn't grown!

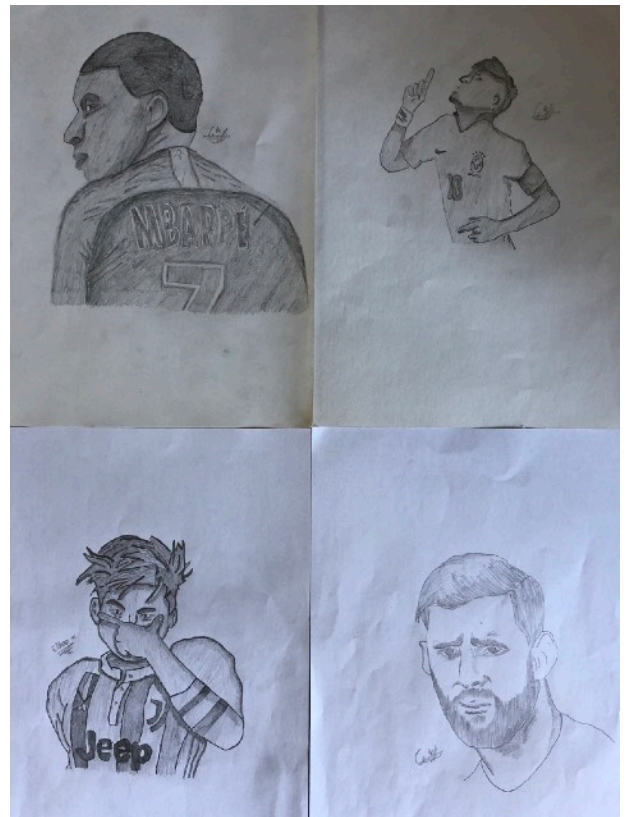

We used string for ours, but you can use an old t- shirt or whatever you have.

You need 8 lengths of string (about 55cm).

Tie all the ends together at one end.

Then take two stands, measure 3 finger widths up and knot together.

Repeat for the other 3 pairs.

Next take 1 stand from 1 pair and 1 stand from the next, measure 3 finger widths and knot together.

Repeat for the other 3 pairs.

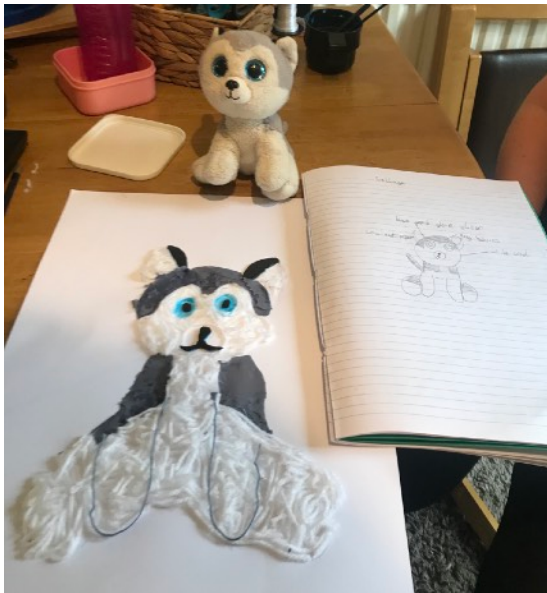
We did a 3rd round of knots. You choose how many you do, but leave enough space to get your pot in at the top.

Then tie all the ends together at the top, make sure all the ends are tight.

Use scissors to trim the top and bottom and you're done.



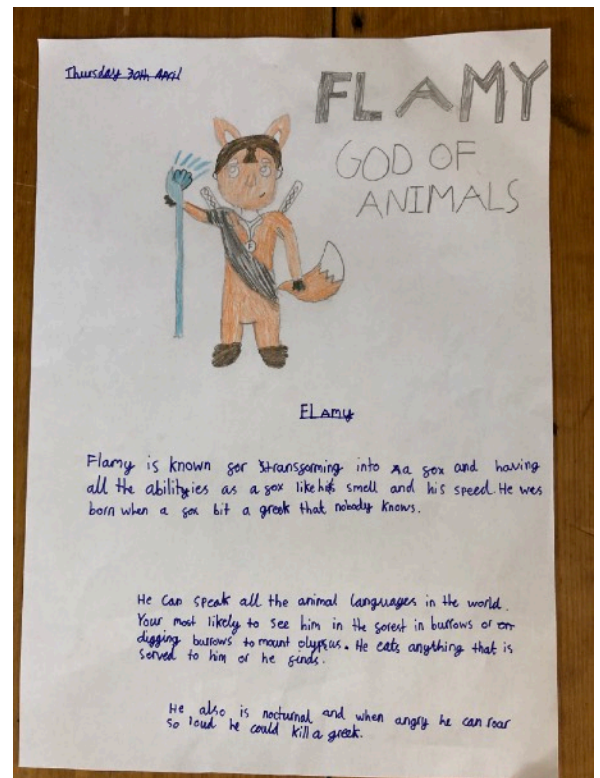
Arwyn has been busy painting beautiful works of art like this one.

Harry baked this delicious cake as part of his wellbeing work.



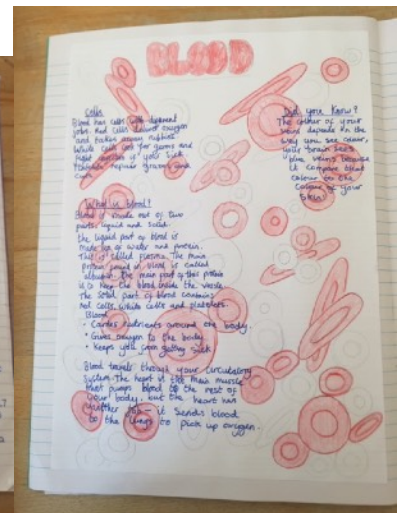
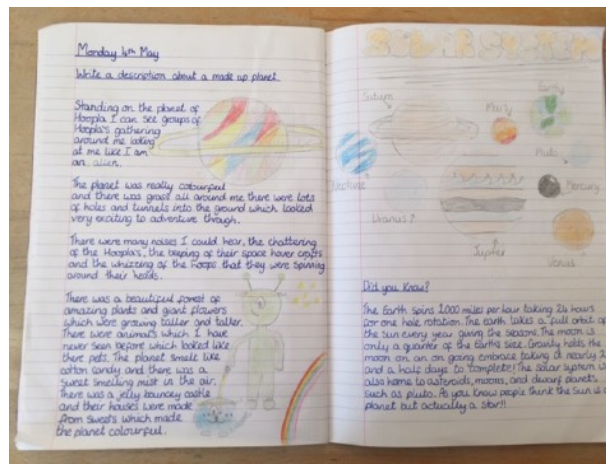
Ben in 6m has been busy baking. The whole family helped out with eating it!
